

How to Appeal for Independent Status

You should complete the 2025-26 Appeal for independent Status if you do not meet the criteria for independent status but have extenuating circumstances and filed your 2025-26 FAFSA without parent information. As a result, you would have been granted provisional independent status by the federal processor.

The Higher Education Act allows financial aid administrators to consider dependency overrides on a case-by-case basis for students with extenuating circumstances.

The following scenarios are not grounds for a dependency override:

- Parents are unwilling to provide their information on the FAFSA.
- Parents are unwilling or unable to provide financial support.
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency.
- Student is not claimed as dependent on parent tax return.

Documented situations that could merit a dependency override include the following:

- An abusive home situation that is detrimental to your physical or mental well-being.
- Abandonment by parents.
- Incarceration or institutionalization of both parents.
- Parents lack the physical or mental capacity to raise their children.
- Parents whereabouts unknown or parents cannot be located.
- Parents hospitalized for an extended period.
- An unsuitable household (e.g., student removed from the household and placed in foster care).

Dependent students who do not have documented extenuating circumstances but filed the FAFSA without parental information shall only be eligible for Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan from the FAFSA unless they subsequently correct the FAFSA to include parental information.

Follow the instructions on the 2025-26 Appeal for Independent Status form and submit all requested documentation to the Financial Aid Office.
